The Racing Review

A new feature for the monthly Doings this year will be the Racing Review, which will cover what is going on in the fleets at DSC, on the race course at the lake, and every now and then, a story about how the club members did when they went on the road to regattas elsewhere. This is the old “fleets” page, and more sailing topics will be covered by the Rear Commodore in his column.

Ron Dettwiler has agreed to do the racing stats each week, and pass them along to Mark for posting on the web site, and to me for use in the monthly Doings. The goal is to have the results and standings both on line and up to date in the monthly Doings.

This particular issue the better title would be “Racing Preview” rather than “review” as right now it is just get ready time and get excited about the 2010 racing program that has some major new and exciting ideas for all.

The 2010 roster when it comes to you will have full details, but for this issue of the Doings maybe just some highlights will get you ready to be there in 2010. The easiest thing to start with is a list of what has NOT changed for the coming year, and here is that list:

1. The club will still have two racing series, Spring Series and Fall Series.
2. The club will present awards for top three, Handicap, for each series, using the same award criteria as in the past (best 12 races).
3. The club will still determine a Club Champion for the year.
4. There will be club racing on Saturdays with a race committee running the races.
5. It takes three boats to make a race, and three like boats to make a fleet race.

That’s about all that is the same – now get ready for the new and exciting parts!

1. Racing for scoring, with a race committee, will be **only** on the first three Saturdays of each month, and only in the morning. On the 3rd Saturday of each month, racing will be preceded by a FREE Sailors Breakfast at the clubhouse! The concept of “honor racing” which did not require a race committee will not occur this year, but all are encouraged to just go sail after the morning races.
2. There will be no Sunday racing or afternoon races for official scoring purposes.
3. There will be no need to “qualify” for entering the club championship sailoff. Any and all members are welcome to enter the sailoff portion of the event.
4. The club champion will be determined using TWO weekends of racing. The first 3 race weekend will determine the top 50% or 10 boats, whichever is greater, on that day. They qualify for the Championship Race the following week! The second weekend will be only for those that qualified the previous weekend, another 3 race regatta, and the winner of that days’ racing will be the club champion. See the roster for all the details.
5. Informal and casual or match racing or what have you happens every Saturday afternoon as you desire! A happy hour and social at the clubhouse occurs after EVERY race day!
6. The Catalina 22 fleet has teamed with 4 other fleets, to support each others regattas, all within easy driving distance. This should lead to a large number of boats being at DSC and racing with us! Go on line to www.usawaterways.com/GRITS and check out the special web site, and if you are a DSC C22 person, no matter what skill level, go sign up – there is NO costs involved – just fun!!

The Racing Review page will be open to all fleets and racers for ideas, comments, helpful hints, whatever helps build our racing program and skills. Just send me your notes and comments and I’ll add them to Dettwiler’s stats and we will have us a fun year on the water!
